

CCCM Cluster Meeting Minutes Bagaicha, Jawalakhel, Kathmandu

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Participants: ACTED, ASIA, CordAid, GOAL, IOM, OCHA Assessment Unit, People In Need, Salvation Army, UNICEF (WASH & CP)

ACTION POINTS

1. Reports from Focus Group Discussion in Chuchepati site in Kathmandu will be shared
2. ASIA to share the details of the return and reconstruction meeting for Langtang IDPs with the CCCM team.
3. The site management trainings schedule will be shared through hub coordinators once available.

Summary:

1. Introduction: Introduction of all present at the meeting.
2. Launch of DTM Round 4 and
 - The CCCM team has recently completed the trainings for DTM staff as well as CCCM staff for IOM and partners. The trainings included 2-day Introduction to CCCM and a 3-day protection-enhanced DTM training.
 - The form for Round 4 has been revised in consultations with other clusters as well as through the training process and is now being translated.
 - Data collection for Round 4 is planned to start by the end of this week and will complete within 2 weeks. At present the team have information for 140 active sites in 13 districts.

3. Updates from Kathmandu Valley:
 - The position paper requesting for further clarity regarding minimum services as well as support for durable solution to families living in displacement sites in Kathmandu have been shared with DUDBC (with MoUD and MoHA in copy).
 - The need for full household assessment for those living in displacement sites in Kathmandu has been raised by DUDBC, and is an on-going discussion with the cluster.

Chuchepati:

- Focus Group Discussions were carried out in Chuchepati site looking at topics around movement of people in and out of the site, livelihood and return intention. Six group discussions were carried out targeting: Head of Households (M/F), Youth (M/F), those from Kathmandu city, and those from other districts. Participations in discussion groups were voluntary.
- Many of the renters said they were unable to return as rental prices have gone up or the spaces are no longer available.

- Majority of those in the groups said that they are continuing with their livelihood activities while living on site, though some have lost tools and resources in the earthquake.
- Regarding return intention, those in the discussion groups mostly belong to 2 groups – either they are planning to return immediately after the monsoon, or they think it will take them at least a year before they will be able to return. They estimated that only 5% of the people on site have returned.
- In addition to the topic raised by facilitators, the communities also raised concern around access to reconstruction assistance, access to services and possible eviction from site. There were also complaints around bias distribution, support from GoN. The communities intend resist eviction if it comes to pass.
- The findings have been informally shared with DUDBC. Reports on findings will also be shared.

Yellow Gumba Site

- Most people from Langtang in Rasuwa District. Mobilisation for support to return is very active. OM Nepal has been appointed by DDRC to lead the effort to support those from Langtang.
- Regular meetings being held on site, ASIA to share the details of the meeting schedule with the CCCM team.

4. Capacity Building

- As mentioned earlier in the meeting, 2 trainings have just been completed last week.
- The cluster is planning to roll out more training at the district level for interested partners and local authorities. The training will focus around site management core activities and will prioritise national staff. The schedule will be shared through hub coordinators once available.

5. AOB

- There is a need for formal recognition of displacement sites by DDRC in Nuwakot, as well as partners to work in these sites. CCCM team to consider capacity for coordination in this district.
- Report of increasing number of IDPs in Kavre.

People In Need

- PIN is working on supporting formation of women committee in 10 displacement sites (8 in Sindhupalchok and 2 in Gorkha) and will be preparing a tool kit that can then be used by other interested agencies. PIN will be doing a short presentation on this work at the next GBV sub-cluster meeting
- In addition, PIN is working to provide temporary shelter and winterisation support in Sindhupalchok and will be targeting displaced population for return.

Next Meeting: National level meeting frequencies to be changed to once a month. The next one will tentatively be on 16th September (to be confirmed)
